

Young Performers Concerto Competition (PHIL)
Instructions, Terms, and Conditions
Thursday, December 1, 2022

- **Eligible Applicants** – All members of FWYO’s Philharmonic Orchestra are eligible to participate, with the exception of the winner from the previous season. Members may only apply & audition once per season, on one instrument. We strongly encourage applicants to seek the approval of their private instructor before applying to this competition.
- **Application Submission** – The competition application must be submitted to Mr. Warren by Sunday, November 6, 2022. Applicants may return a completed copy as an email attachment or submit in person at Orchestra Hall. Mr. Coatney must approve all concerto selections and sign all applications, so please plan ahead to collect his signature!
- **Eligible Repertoire** – One movement of a solo work for your instrument, with orchestral accompaniment, pending Mr. Coatney’s approval. (When appropriate, multiple movements, attacca passages, or a complete one-movement work may qualify.) The total performance time for any selection should not exceed 15 minutes. Memorization is not required. We strongly encourage applicants to seek the guidance of their private instructor when selecting repertoire for this competition. One photocopy of the solo part of your concerto selection must be submitted with the competition application. The original must be in your possession at the competition.
- **Mr. Coatney must approve all concerto selections!** – Applicants must seek Mr. Coatney’s approval and signature in advance. Please email the title/movement/composer of your selected composition to Mr. Warren (dwarren@fwyo.org) or speak directly with Mr. Coatney. If the orchestral parts for your selection are not available in print, or are too difficult for the orchestra to prepare in the limited time available, the selection may not be approved for the competition.
- **Piano Accompaniment** – Competition auditions must be performed with piano accompaniment, and applicants are responsible for arranging and coordinating with their own pianist.
- **Winner** – The competition winner will be determined at the discretion and consensus of the approved jury, and one or more may be offered the opportunity to perform as soloist with the Philharmonic Orchestra on one of the spring concerts. Winning the contest does not guarantee a performance with the Philharmonic Orchestra. The decision of the jury is final and cannot be appealed. Comments, deliberations, and contents of discussions between jury members are sealed and not available for review. The soloist is responsible for preparing for the performance and remaining compliant with the FWYO Code of Conduct and Ensembles Handbook. If preparation is inadequate in the opinion of the conductor or artistic staff or code of conduct infractions occur, the FWYO reserves the right to postpone or cancel the performance. Should the orchestra or individual be unable to perform the work for any reason including, but not limited to, inability to secure performance rights, no availability of parts, selection is deemed too difficult for the ensemble to prepare in the allotted time, weather, injury, natural disaster, or sickness; the FWYO reserves the right to do any of the following: require the individual perform an alternative work, provide an alternative opportunity for performance with piano accompaniment at a concert or recital of FWYO's choosing, postpone the performance, cancel the performance, or offer the performance opportunity to another applicant.
